This week's Spokane Valley City Council meeting began with an invocation, the pledge of allegiance and approval of the following meeting agenda. A motion to excuse Mayor Pam Haley and Councilmember Yaeger passed unanimously.

Special Presentation

Deputy Mayor Hattenburg presented the second You Rock! Community Recognition award to Ms. Jayne Singleton recognizing her significant contributions to our community. Learn more about the You Rock! program at SpokaneValleyWA.gov/YouRock.

Deputy Mayor Comments

Deputy Mayor Hattenburg expressed appreciation for the Spokane Valley Police Department and extended heartfelt condolences to the loved ones of all those impacted by Sunday's tragedy in our community. This incident involved an armed robbery and carjacking, which led to excessive speeds, injuries, the death of an innocent person, and an officer-involved shooting of the suspect.

General Public Comments

Each week, community members can address Councilmembers for up to three minutes during the General Public Comment period, either at the beginning or end of each meeting, in-person or on Zoom.

PUBLIC HEARING

1. 2026-2031 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The TIP is a plan of transportation projects to be implemented in the upcoming six years within Spokane Valley. After holding a public hearing and approval by the Council, the plan must be submitted to the Washington State Department of Transportation. Staff outlined the proposed 2026-2031 TIP:

• Bridge and Grade Separation Projects

3. Aging and Long Term Care of Eastern Washington (ALTCEW) Interlocal Agreement (ILA) Amendment Staff reported that the City joined ALTCEW in 2019 and has had a Councilmember on their governing Board of Directors since that time to represent the interests of Spokane Valley. Councilmember Jessica Yaeger currently serves in this role. Although this does not apply to Spokane Valley's seat on this board, recent congressional actions to the Older Americans Act prohibit ex officio (non-voting) advisory Councilmembers from serving on the board of directors for an area agency. This will necessitate minor revisions to the ILA, and all amendments to the ILA require approval from all participating members, which is why this item is before the Council.

A motion to approve Amendment No. 4 to the Interlocal Agreement for the Eastern Washington Area Agency on Aging in substantially the form presented passed with 4 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

NON-ACTION ITEMS

4. Spokane Transit Authority (STA) presentation: Argonne Station

Mr. Karl Otterstrom, STA Co-Interim CEO and Chief Planning and Development Officer and Mr. Dan Wells, STA Director of Capital Development, presented information about the I-90/Valley High Performance Transit Corridor and the proposed new Argonne Station.

5. Local Solid Waste Financial Assistance (LSWFA) Grant, 2025-2027 Biennium

Staff shared details about a Washington State Department of Ecology grant program which provides funding for planning and implementation for local solid and hazardous waste plan development and maintenance. The grant is non-competitive, reimbursement-based and requires a 25% match. In February 2025, the Coun-

Hiring

The U.S. Department of Justice is currently accepting applications for the 2025 COPS CHP grant; the application deadline is July 1, 2025. If awarded in full, the 2025 grant would provide a maximum of \$125,000 per new law enforcement officer, spread over a three-year period; there is a minimum 25% local match requirement. Spokane Valley applied for this grant in 2024 and was awarded \$1.25 million, which is being applied to fund a portion of the ten additional police officer positions added in 2025. The City does not typically use grant funding for recurring expenses, but staff believe City Council's priorities and goals related to public safety align well with the purposes of this grant. Staff will be seeking the Council's approval to submit a grant application. The Council reached consensus to bring this item back at a future date for a motion consideration.

7. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Joint Personnel Recovery Agency (JPRA) for Training within Spokane Valley

JPRA and 336 Training Group of the Air Force (collectively referred to as JPRA) approached the City requesting authorization to conduct personnel training within Spokane Valley. The training is part of military personnel training in specialized survival, evasion, resistance, and escape within urban environments. Staff have negotiated a MOU with JPRA for Council's consideration, primarily to ensure thorough communication with the City about planned training events. Council reached consensus to bring the MOU with JPRA back at a future meeting for a motion consideration.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Council moved into Executive Session to discuss the potential acquisition or sale of real estate. No action

2. Resolution 25-012: Approval of Draft 2026-2031 **Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)** A motion to approve Resolution 25-012, adopting the 2026-2031 TIP as presented passed with 4 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

cil approved a motion for the City to apply for this grant, and for the 2025-2027 biennium, Spokane Valley's share allocation is \$158,576, and when combined with matching funds, the total available budget is \$211,435. Recommended projects for 2025-2026 are:

- 1. Homeless Encampment Response (estimated \$40,000-\$60,000 annually)

I am sure many people are welcoming a cooling trend here in the region. It makes it more comfortable to be out on the water for sure. I am very pleased with the Smoker Craft I am driving this year, with the removable side, and back covers on a hard frame. I do have a portable mister that I put on board, for the really hot days.

I introduced Tom Verschueren to fishing for smallmouth bass many years ago on Banks Lake, and he instantly liked it. He likes catching bass on Moses Lake, too, and we headed

down there last Wednesday. We dumped the Smoker Craft in at Peninsula Park and ran a short distance over to Gaileys Island. I kept an eye on my Garmin, as there are some shallow rocky points that extend quite a ways off the shore, and I also tilt the Mercury 250, so I don't drag the skag over them. I also trimmed the Minn Kota very high, so it wouldn't bump the rocks. As we made our way around the island, we landed some smallmouth and a largemouth and lost several fish as well. At one point, as we worked our way along the west shore of

the island, I thought I was snagged on the bottom. In frustration I jerked very hard on my rod twice, trying to break free. To my surprised the rod jerked back! Turns out it was a big largemouth. It was big enough that when I tried to lift it into the boat it broke off. Boy, what a dumb move. This week's photo is of a small largemouth that I managed to land.

The announcement at the North of Falcon meeting in Wenatchee on March 18th that we may not have a summer run salmon season on the upper Columbia this year sent shock waves through the angling community. I was sitting next to Mike Mauk, who conducts the Brewster King Salmon Derby, and he just shrugged after seeing the presentation. "It is what it is", he said. "Guess it's going to be a sockeye derby this year." The WDFW representatives did say that their prediction was based on their forecasts and they could only hope that the return would surprise them. I know I am not alone when I log onto the Fish Count page on my website every day to see the fish passage numbers at Bonneville Dam. I also looked at a Columbia River Joint Staff Report that stated that at the time of the review the sockeye return was at the lowest in ten years. The summer run count on Bonneville for June 12th showed a total of 21,000 had passed through the dam. The number of salmon that passed over the dam that day was ahead of the ten-year average of 1,813. Last year on this day the number was 1,842, and the current year's number was 1,894. I sure hope the trend continues!



The sockeye numbers are still below the ten-year average and behind last year's run incredible record return. When the run really hits at Bonneville the numbers soar, so keep your eyes on this one day-to-day.

As many of you know, I have a large catalogue of videos on my YouTube channel. There are over 275 videos in the collection, with over 2.5 million views of them. Some are short informational "How-Tos" and many show fishing destinations. I always include descriptions of where we are fishing and what we were using to catch the fish we are after. I recently posted two bass fishing videos. One on Moses Lake and the other on the San Poil Arm of Lake Roosevelt. Also, I have done a couple of series that show popular fishing lakes in the region. I did a series on Grant County lakes last year, and the year before that I did a series on the Grant County PUD Recreation Sites. In these videos I show the size of the sites or acres of the lakes, and the fishing opportunities available at them. I have just started a project for Okanogan County Tourism and will be visiting 20 fishing destinations and shooting videos describing them and why anglers should add them to their list of places to go. So, look for six new videos soon on the Dave Graybill YouTube channel as I work through this project.

I managed to get all of these shot in one day. I started at Alta Lake, then drove up the Methow Valley, and took a right just below Twisp to shoot one on Davis Lake. From there I passed through the town of Winthrop and stopped at Pearygin Lake and then on to Patterson Lake. I headed back

down the valley and took a right at Pateros and took the short drive north of Brewster to Rat Lake. My last stop was at the Washburn Island Ponds, not far from the turn off to Bridgeport from Highway 97 to Highway 17. I should mention that many people know this lake as Chicken Creek, but it is listed as Washburn Island Pond in the Washington Sport Fishing pamphlet. It was a long but fun day. I talked to some great people at some of the lakes, and although I did experience some wind at some locations it didn't interfere with my shooting of the videos too badly. I

encourage you to visit the Dave Graybill YouTube channel and let me know what you think of the work I am doing.

After the weekend I will be rolling up my sleeves and writing my next E-Letter. I will have some great information for folks on a variety of fisheries in the region. There are tremendous opportunities on our lakes and the Columbia River, and I will touch on them as I continue to keep an eye on the returns of summer Chinook and sockeye.

My next adventure will be to Banks Lake for Father's Day, with my daughter Whitney. She really likes fishing Banks for smallmouth bass but has also had some spectacular success with walleye. My friend Brian Nielson, of BJs Guide Service, sent me a great report on walleye fishing recently on Banks Lake, so we may spend more time trying for them. We don't fish very hard and take swim breaks and generally just enjoy being together on one of our region's most scenic fishing destinations. I hope all of you Dads have wonderful special day.

Congratulations on making the choice to add a new member to your family! Before your furry bundle of joy comes home make sure you are dealing with a safe source & asking the right questions. Here are a few tips to help you make a responsible choice and avoid disreputable breeders, pet shops or puppy mills in the process!

1) HOUSE CALL: It may be tempting to meet the breeder somewhere in between but drive the extra hour and see where the puppies are being raised. Pay attention to the conditions in their home and



kennel. Are the kennels clean? Odor free? Are the dogs on site clean, well fed, lively and friendly? Do any of the animals exhibit signs of malnutrition or illness? Visiting the premises is a huge indication whether or not the puppy you are buying is socialized, loved and healthy.



2) MEET THE PARENTS: While on site take a bit of time to interact with the puppies parents. This will give you insight into what their puppies may be like as they mature. Pay attention

to their size, demeanor, temperament and appearance. Can you handle this size of dog? Does the breeds energy level match your own? Does either parent have any health issues? Genetic issues?

3) TALK SHOP: Sitting down with the breeder and getting to know them, their business and their dogs is crucial to making an educated purchase. How long have they been breeding? What is their experience with the breed? Are they involved with any breed clubs or organizations? Do they



offer a health guarantee? Is there a purchase contract and what does that entail? Can we call you with questions or concerns? Can you get a copy of all health and registration

Fake checks might look like business or personal checks, cashier's checks, money orders, or a check delivered electronically. Here's what to know about fake check scams.

In a fake check scam, a person you don't know asks you to deposit a check. It's usually for more than they owe you, and it's sometimes for several thousand dollars. They tell you to send some of the money back to them or to another person. They always have a good story to explain why you can't keep all the money. They might say they need you to cover taxes or fees for a prize, to buy supplies for a job, to send back money they overpaid, or something else. But this is a scam.

Why Do These Scams Work?

These scams work because fake checks generally look just like real checks, even to bank employees. They are often printed with the names and addresses of legitimate financial institutions. They may even be real checks written on bank accounts that belong to someone whose identity has been stolen. It can take weeks for a bank to figure out that the check is a fake.

Fake Checks and Your Bank

By law, banks have to make deposited funds available quickly, usually within two days. When the funds are made available in your account, the bank may say the check has "cleared," but that doesn't mean it's a good check. Fake checks can take weeks to be discovered and untangled. By that time, the scammer has any money you sent, and you're stuck paving the money back to the bank.

Your best bet: Don't rely on money from a check unless you know and trust the person you're dealing with.

How To Avoid a Fake Check Scam

Never use money from a check to send gift cards, money orders, cryptocurrency, or to wire money to anyone who asks you to. Many scammers demand that you buy gift cards and send them the PIN numbers, buy cryptocurrency and transfer it to them, or send money through wire transfer services like Western Union or MoneyGram. Once you do, it's like you've given them cash. It's almost impossible to get it back.

Toss offers that ask you to pay for a prize. If it's free, you shouldn't have to pay to get it. Only scammers will ask you to pay to collect a "free" prize. Don't accept a check for more than the selling price. You can bet it's a scam.

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4 Signs of Potential Electrial Hazards in a Home



Homeowners know that the work of maintaining a home is never done. Cleaning is a daily task associated with homeownership, and such sessions can reveal more than dust buildup or dirty walls and surfaces.

When cleaning a home, homeowners can pull double duty and look for potentially hazardous situations. For example, vacuuming and dusting sessions can present a great opportunity to spot electrical hazards that might otherwise go unseen. With that in mind, homeowners can keep an eye out for these four signs of potential electrical hazards when working around the house.

1. Tingling when touching an electrical appliance: The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) advises homeowners to call a qualified electrician immediately if they experience a tingling feeling when touching an electrical appliance. The Electrical Safety Office notes experiencing a tingle or the feeling of being shocked is not normal. Homeowners who experience such a feeling should avoid the location and warn others in the home to do the same.

2. Wall outlets that look or feel unusual: Wall outlets do not garner much attention, as many are low enough to be out of sight or even behind furniture. So a cleaning session might be the only time homeowners will notice issues with wall outlets. The NFPA notes discolored outlets or outlets that feel warm to the touch is a sign of an electrical problem. Various issues can cause outlets to look or feel unusual. An outlet could be short-circuiting or wires could be damaged, and each issue merits the attention of a qualified electrician.

3. Foul odors: An odor that calls to mind burning rubber is another indicator of an electrical problem. Various electrical experts indicate such odors can be indicative of damaged wiring, an overloaded circuit or loose connections, each of which poses a significant safety hazard. The NFPA urges homeowners to contact a qualified electrician immediately if they sense a smell of burning rubber in their homes.

4. Flickering lights: Homeowners won't need to wait until cleaning sessions to notice flickering lights. Such flickering is hard to miss regardless of what residents are doing inside a home. Sometimes lights flicker because of a loose bulb, so homeowners who notice flickering should first turn off the light, let the bulb cool down if need be and then check to make sure it isn't loose. If the bulb isn't loose, then lights could be flickering for a multitude of reasons. A loose connection can cause flickering, as can an overloaded circuit. Homeowners also may not realize that not all bulbs and dimmer switches are designed to work together. For example, modern LED light bulbs often require the installation of specific dimmer switches or the lights won't operate properly. Flickering can result if these products are not compatible. If a home is old, then flickering lights could be due to old wiring that needs to be replaced. Daily and weekly cleaning sessions can be a good time for homeowners to perform a quick audit of electrical outlets and lights to ensure everything is safe and working properly.

AFTER-CLOSING HEADACHES



Designated Brokers (the firm's boss) periodically receive calls after closings from disgruntled buyers or their agents who complain that things didn't go as they expected. A majority of the time it is because there was a misunderstanding about which items were to be included in a sale. In a recent case the buyers had looked at a home that had a newer stainless refrigerator but found after closing that the refrigerator they thought they were buying with the home had been replaced by a cheap, used, Walmart version that had considerably less value. The seller was either less-than-honest, or they interpreted the Purchase Agreement language to mean that there just had to be some sort of a refrigerator there.

The boiler plate language in any state-wide-form is clear to assert that when there are included personal items, it means the exact items that were there when the buyer saw the property. Of course if that is not going to be the case, the seller has an obvious obligation to clarify that during negotiations. They may want to dig up and take that rose bush that grandma gave them or the chandelier in the dining room that is a family heir loom. If so, they ought to make that very clear in the listing remarks or better yet, remove them from the property before any showings occur so there cannot possibly be any misunderstanding. If the wife loves her new refrigerator and doesn't want to part with it, then that fact should be made known and negotiated in writing.

Another topic that causes post closing headaches is when items are left on the property that should have been removed, such as debris or garbage or even vehicle hulks (that are difficult to remove especially when there are no titles). Some sellers naively think they can come back later to cherry pick personal items left after a closing, but at the same time brazenly ignore the mess they are leaving.

Real estate purchase agreements almost always include addenda that specify exactly what will or what will not be left behind by the seller. In those cases the brokers should get a gold star! Professional brokers will certainly coach their clients on these topics, but are at a loss to control those situations where one of the parties acts dishonestly or in bad faith and does not perform according to the contract.

VAN GISBERGEN DOMINATES IN MEXICO CITY By Holly Cain, NASCAR Wire Service

MEXICO CITY (June 15, 2025) – An overcast sky and early afternoon drizzle could not dampen the enthusiasm or energy of the huge crowd at Mexico City's Autodromo Hermanos Rodriquez Sunday for the first points-paying NASCAR Cup Series race outside the United States in half a century.

And they were not disappointed.

As he did at another NASCAR's "inaugural race" – on the streets of Chicago two years ago in his series debut - New Zealander Shane Van Gisbergen, 36, prevailed again. This time, driving the No. 88 Chevrolet for Trackhouse Racing, he claimed a huge 16.567-second victory over Joe Gibbs Racing's Christopher Bell in the Viva Mexico 250 – the largest margin of victory of the season.

The three-time Australian Supercars champion Van Gisbergen – in his first fulltime season at the NASCAR Cup Series level – won pole position and led 60 of the race's 100 laps, including the final 32, easily pulling away from the field to claim his first ever berth in the NASCAR Cup Series Playoffs with the win. "What a week, I've really enjoyed myself here, but felt like rubbish this morning," said Van Gisbergen, who's victory was only his second top-10 finish of the season. As thrilled as the crowd may have been to watch Van Gisbergen's masterwork, there was no doubt they were there to cheer on his Trackhouse teammate, Mexico-native Daniel Suárez, who was celebrated as a hero after his win in Saturday's NASCAR Xfinity Series race.

The grandstands chanted "Dan-iel Daniel" and held up signs of support. And Suárez was emotional standing by his car on the starting grid as a local children's choir sang the Mexican National Anthem before the race. Ultimately, he ended up 19th.

The victory was particularly rewarding for Van Gisbergen, considering the amount of adversity he faced this week in Mexico. He was sick to his stomach Sunday morning and his crew showed up a day later than the other teams after some travel challenges.

Not only did Van Gisbergen prevail in some tough circumstances, Bell's work was also impressive, considering he finished runner-up after starting 31st. John Hunter Nemechek, Chase Briscoe, Cole Custer, championship points leader William Byron and Chris Buescher rounded out the top-five.

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The series returns stateside for The Great American Getaway 400 (2 p.m. ET, Amazon Prime, MRN, SiriusXM NASCAR Radio) at Pocono Raceway, June 22.

MADISON, Ill. (June 15, 2025) - Nobody can call Kyle Kirkwood just a street-circuit specialist anymore.

Kirkwood used pace found with help from his teammates and masterful strategy in a chaotic, exciting race to win the Bommarito Automotive Group 500 presented by Axalta and Valvoline on Sunday night at World Wide Technology Raceway near St. Louis.

It was the fifth career victory for Kirkwood and career-best third win this season. But most importantly to Kirkwood, it was his first career oval victory after four wins on street circuits.

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en Chevrolet. Christian Rasmussen finished a career-best third in the No. 21 ECR Splenda Chevrolet after starting 25th, making 62 on-track passes.

Six time NTT INDYCAR SERIES champion Scott Dixon finished fourth in the No. 9 PNC Bank Chip Ganassi Racing Honda, his best result since he placed second in the season opener in March at St. Petersburg.

Santino Ferrucci continued the recent upswing of A.J. Foyt Enterprises as he produced his third straight top-five finish this season in the No. 14 Bommarito Automotive Group Chevrolet.

The 260 lap race, in which 14 of the 27 drivers led, came down to an intriguing gambit between two fuel strategies and navigating thickets of traffic over the last 50 laps.
